## SYNOPSIS – DESPERATELY SEEKING MADONA BY JOSHUA KOFFMAN

MARY RUBENSTEIN is sick of her department store job, living at home and being unsure of what to do with her life. After getting fired, she consults her best friend COLLEEN, a Goth girl who loves working at a funeral home. Through their conversation Mary comes to the conclusion that she must go to New York City and find Madonna so that she can seek her counsel—because after all, everything she touches "turns to gold."

Mary and Colleen don't have a lot of money, but JASON (Mary's geeky high-school former co-worker) has \$212 cash, so they take him along for the ride. On the train there, Mary meets GLENDA WEINSTEIN, a NYC boutique- owner who grew up in Newburgh as well. Once in the city, Mary quickly realizes she isn't the only person who dresses like her idol Madonna. After failing to connect with any of these girls, Mary eagerly seeks out the return address noted on her "Madonna" correspondences over the years.
